LB 276, 279, 308,
LB 986, 954, 637, 605

PRESIDENT: Roll call vote, all right.

SENATOR GEORGE: Now you said ten are excused?

PRESIDENT: Nine now with Senator Labeledz is here.

SENATOR GEORGE: But we are still looking for four people I guess.

PRESIDENT: Senator Labeledz, we are voting on LB 986 for your information.

SENATOR GEORGE: Are we still looking for three people?

PRESIDENT: We are looking for about four people now. Senator Sieck, Senator Haberman.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, we can start the roll call.

PRESIDENT: All right, start the roll call. Senator Sieck and Senator Haberman is here now. We will proceed with the roll call. The issue is...the motion is to advance LB 986 to E & R initial. All those in favor vote aye. opposed nay and have a roll call vote.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote found on pages 974-975 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 12 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. LB 986 is advanced to E & R initial. That will conclude the matters on special order. Speaker Marvel, the Chair recognizes you. The Speaker has an announcement.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We are putting out a special order sheet for about eighteen or nineteen bills but I would call to your attention, the special order for tomorrow. If I could have the attention of the legislators, I think you might be interested in this. There are six bills scheduled for special order tomorrow. If you would like to put them down, that is 637 which is Senator Maresh's bill; 605 which is Senator Haberman's bill; 954 which is Senator DeCamp's bill; 276 which is the Banking Committee bill; 279 which is the Banking Committee bill; 308 which is the banking committee bill. These bills must be heard in the order in which they are given, 637, 605, 954, and then the three bills which have to do with usury. We have a cancellation sheet up there because 276, 279 and 308 were set for the thirteenth. Evidently the problem is more imminent than some people thought but in fairness to those who had those three bills tomorrow, I did not
