SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of 276 as amended to E & R for Review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? The motion is the advancement of the bill. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion carried. The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp would like to expedite the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: So ordered. Do you have a resolution to read, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Before the Legislature gets away from us we will reconvene at 1:30. Do you want to read the resolution? The motion is the suspension of the rules so we can take up a resolution that has to do with Senator Dworak. So the motion before the House is the suspension of the rules. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays on the rule suspension, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The rules are suspended. The Chair recognizes Senator Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: Read the resolution.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 207 was introduced by the membership. (Read LR 207 as found on pages 997 and 998 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. President, I know that most members, including myself, have expressed our sorrow and deep grief in terms of the passing of Don's Mother. I know that all of you hold Don in the same high esteem as I do, and certainly I wanted us to convey this message to him. I ask the adoption of the resolution.
