LR 206, 209, 210

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The resolution, 206, is adopted. We will proceed then with LR 208, Mr. Clerk. Senator Koch is not here so we will pass over LR 208 and go to LR 209, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 209 was introduced by Senator Marsh. Mr. President, Senator Marsh's resolution is found on page 1025. (Read LR 209.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Good morning, Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I am very pleased and proud this week to bring this resolution to the legislative floor. I know everyone will want to support it and help us go on record as acknowledging the contribution which the older worker has made to our state to our communities and to the future of the state as well. They have left a heritage for us and a gift which younger persons will need to follow. We appreciate our older workers. We want to acknowledge their contribution and we want to say thank you in a public way. I urge your adoption of LR 209.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion on LR 209? Hearing none, the question before the House is the adoption of LR 209. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. LR 209 is adopted. The next...there is a resolution added to your agenda. The Chair is advised that LB (sic) 210 is ready for adoption by Senators Cullan and Schmit. Do you want to read that one? Senator Schmit does not want to take it up at this time? Okay, do you want to read it, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 210 was introduced by Senators Cullan and Schmit. (Read LR 210.) It is on page 1036, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion then at all? I think Senator Schmit said that he would just submit this resolution. Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: That is right. I move adoption of the resolution.
