SENATOR SCHMIT: I have no objection, Mr. President, just so the bill does come up as soon as possible.

PRESIDENT: All right. The Speaker is not in the room but if someone will advise the Speaker that it is by agreement laid over until the Speaker wants to put it on the agenda at the earliest convenience. We will proceed then with consent calendar if that is laid over. Everyone has their sheet of the consent calendar dated March 7. Yes, we are ready for the consent calendar. We will proceed then with LB 818A. Senator Warner, could someone just handle this in the absence of Senator Fowler, this A bill, to carry our the provisions of LB 818?

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 818A was introduced by Senator Fowler on behalf of the Retirement Committee. (Read title.)

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move that the A bill be advanced, obviously for the bill that has already been advanced.

PRESIDENT: All right, that is correct. The motion is to advance the A bill on 818A. Is there any discussion? All right, seeing none the Chair will call the question. All those in favor of advancing LB 818A to E & R initial vote aye, opposed nay.

SPEAKER MARVEL PRESIDING

SPEAKER MARVEL: Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance 818A, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We pass over 865. It has been taken off the consent calendar, go to 916.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 916 was introduced by Senator Clark. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 23. It was referred to Banking, advanced to General File. I have no amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Clark, do you have anything you wish to say?

SENATOR CLARK: Mr. President and members, this bill was put in for the state banks. What it does is to bring the state banks under the same category or privileges that national banks have. All it does is to allow the Banking Director
