LB 689, 849

PRESIDENT: Motion to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 689. Any discussion? If not, all those in favor of adopting the E & R amendments to LB 689 signify by saying aye, opposed nay. The E & R amendments are adopted on LB 689. Are there any further amendments?

CLERK: Yes, I have two. The first by Senator Sieck and it is found on page 977 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Sieck.

SENATOR SIECK: Mr. President, members of the body, we are having a little difficulty here. We found that the amendment isn't corrected as we thought it should have been in the Journal so I am going to ask you to lay this over so we get these corrections in there.

PRESIDENT: All right, that is a unanimous consent request that the bill be laid over until you can straighten that out?

SENATOR SIECK: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Any objection? All right, LB 689 is laid over until such time as the matter can be corrected. We will proceed then with LB 849.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 849 has E & R amendments that were adopted by the body on March 10th. I now have an amendment by Senator Fitzgerald. Read Fitzgerald amendment as found on page 1105, Legislative Journal. That is offered by Senator Fitzgerald.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Fitzgerald.

SENATOR FITZGERALD: Mr. Speaker and members, this is just corrective measures there on the first one, "shall" to "may". This refers to the section of the statute that requires the State Athletic Commission to set the fees of referee judges. At present the fees vary to such a great extent, depending on the type of bout, whether it is a pro or amateur that the Commissioner setting the fees would create a great deal of unneeded interference into the business of the bouts. So the Commissioner would like to have this here changed.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? The question then is the adoption of the Fitzgerald amendment on LB 849. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all
