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that livestock is going to bring. If you have publicly owned entity, you have trouble because you can't really do that and you just can't operate that way. The sale barn that I was involved in, we operated for some ten years at no profit whatsoever. We finally did sell it and got our money back without interest for those ten years time but I think I agree with Senator Beutler that this is getting into something that we have no business sticking our nose into. If a sale barn can't make it on its own with good operation, it is not going to make it at all if it is publicly operated. For one thing, if you are a buyer and someone ups the price on you, you are going to be unhappy. If you are a seller and they lower the price on you to satisfy the buyer, he is going to be unhappy. So it has to be something that works out in a competitive basis, and when you start putting the public into it, you take that part away from it. So just on general principles, I oppose that sort of financing for sale barns and I am not too sure I even support it for the Cornhusker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp, Senator Wesely and then Senator Murphy.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I am not going to oppose Sam's amendment but I have got a couple of questions, and, Sam, I want to give you the award. Every year, you know, there is one amendment you can pick out only four or five words long and it's got a lot of dynamite in it. Sam, this says public market facilities and you've been talking about, well, sale barns, and when we talk about sale barns, we commonly understand the cows and piggies and the chickens go through and the guy goes (auctioneer chant). Question? Under the definition or under the words "public market facilities", I don't read sale barns, could you tell me specifically what would be excluded because I think it includes just about everything, possibly not railroads and not...no, I think it might include everything else. What doesn't it include and why?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Senator DeCamp, I think that the language was drawn to include sale barns and that is the primary intent of it and I don't read it as broadly perhaps as you do. I think a "public market facility" would be a place where products are sold....and exchanged....

SENATOR DeCAMP: Products are sold and grocery stores,
