SENATOR CULLAN: It certainly is not intended to be a retail facility...

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, at this point in time, I think it is probably unfair of me to slow the progress of this bill. I did simply wish to propose this. I didn't think it would be as controversial as it would. It is not my bill and I don't wish to slow it down so in deference to the introducer I would withdraw the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, Senator Cullan has withdrawn his amendment.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely, do you wish to speak?

SENATOR WESELY: I just want to move the advancement of LB 986.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, 986. Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: Well, in regard to advancing the bill, it was my intent to congratulate Senator Cullan for having precisely put into words what I have been telling you all along. There is an awful lot of bull in this bill.
