CLERK: (Read LB 958A on Final Reading.)

SENATOR CLARK: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: Record vote read. (See page 1191, Legislative Journal.) 37 ayes, 1 nay, 5 excused and not voting, 6 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is declared passed.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Newell asks unanimous consent to lay over LB 619.
