LB 485

All right, all those in favor of rejecting the committee amendments vote aye to LB 485, vote aye, opposed vote no. Senator Newell, you need 25 votes. Have you all voted? The motion is the rejection of the committee amendments. Have you all voted? Senator Johnson, have you voted? Okay, thank you. The motion is to reject the committee amendments to LB 485. Does anybody else wish to vote? Senator Newell. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to reject the committee amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The committee amendments are rejected. Now what is the next?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Newell moves to amend the bill and his amendments are found printed separately in your bill books.

SENATOR NEWELL: This is a white copy. This has been a worked out compromise. I would like to adopt these amendments. I will explain them when we discuss the bill. They become the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Newell amendments. Senator Schmit, do you wish the floor?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Newell a question if he would yield please.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Newell.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Senator Newell, has these...

SENATOR NEWELL: Go ahead, Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: When did you draw these amendments, Senator Newell?
