SPEAKER MARVEL PRESIDING

SPEAKER MARVEL: Please record your presence. Fitzgerald you can't do that. We will keep calling you back then. How long will it take? Record.

CLERK: Quorum present Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you have any items to read in?

CLERK: Yes, sir, Mr. President. A communication from the Governor addressed to the Clerk. Read letter concerning LBs 94, 276, 279, 655 and 693. (See page 1265 of the Journal)

Mr. President, your committee on E & R respectfully reports they have carefully examined LB 485 and recommend the same be placed on Select File with amendments and 485A Select File.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is that it?

CLERK: Yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the first bill is LB 768.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 768 was introduced by Senator Marvel at the request of the Governor. Read LB 768. The bill was originally read on January 15th, referred to Appropriations, the bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments by Senator Warner's Appropriations Committee.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the committee amendment. LB 768 is the deficiency appropriation relative to special education transportation. As the bill was introduced it reflects what the Department of Education's estimate was for the deficiency for reimbursement of local school districts. Their final figures actually reduce those estimates in the case what is contained in this bill is the deficiency for transportation reimbursement. The original request was \$1,066,000, the committee amendment reduces that to \$986,000. The other portion of the bill reflects the LB 403 appropriation, the original estimate for the deficit was 5.6 million and it would be reduced down to \$4,749,000 approximately. I would move for the adoption of the committee amendments.
