LB 986

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed on Final Reading. The last bill on Final Reading this morning, LB 986. The Clerk will read.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Venditte asks unanimous consent to lay over LB 986.

SPEAKER MARVEL: There is a unanimous request. Is there an objection? Senator Walter objects. Senator Venditte.

SENATOR VENDITTE: Mr. Speaker, could I have a question answered at this point, Mr. Speaker, relative to the Final Reading of the bill? Would that be in order?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Direct your question to the Chair. What is your question?

SENATOR VENDITTE: First of all, Mr. Chairman...

SPEAKER MARVEL: You asked unanimous consent and there is an objection. Now do you have another motion you wish to make?

SENATOR VENDITTE: Well, I think the only thing in order at this point then, Mr. Chairman, would be to make a motion to have the bill laid over maybe till the early part of next week.

SPEAKER MARVEL: No, we are not in the process of laying bills over at this particular time. If you want the bill laid over, we can lay it over for one day. We are not bracketing bills at this stage.

SENATOR VENDITTE: I would so move. Now that would be fine. One day would be sufficient time.

SPEAKER MARVEL: So the motion before the House is that LB 986.....

SENATOR VENDITTE: Mr. Chairman, could I explain why I....

SPEAKER MARVEL: Just a moment. 986 be laid over until tomorrow. Senator Venditte.
