SPEAKER MARVEL: Now we are talking about LB 743 and I heard somebody say it was the wrong bill.

SENATOR LEWIS: No, that is correct.

SPEAKER MARVEL: 743, okay, is there any objections? If not, so ordered. The Clerk will read LB 782 on Final Reading.

CLERK: Final Reading of LB 782.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: Record vote read. (See pages 1381 and 1382, Legislative Journal.) 41 ayes, 1 nay, 5 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is passed on Final Reading. The Clerk will now read LB 808.

CLERK: Final Reading of LB 808.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: Record vote read. (See page 1382, Legislative Journal.) 42 ayes, 0 nays, 5 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed on Final Reading. The Clerk will explain the reason why we need to lay over LB 849.

CLERK: Mr. President, we need to read 849 following LB 834 in order to not run into a problem in repealing certain sections and modifying others, at least, that is what I have been so advised by the Revisor's office. So we have been requested to have the bill laid over until such time as we read LB 834 on Final Reading and LB 834 is bracketed on Final Reading for an A bill.
