LB 862, 874

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, then we need to lay over 849 and 849A?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is there any objections? If not, so ordered. The Clerk will now read on Final Reading LB 862.

CLERK: Final Reading of LB 862 commenced.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The rules state that we must be seated at our desks on Final Reading. Okay, go ahead, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Final Reading of LB 862 continued.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? Those in favor vote aye, opposed no. LB 862 on Final Reading. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: Record vote read. (See page 1383, Legislative Journal.) 39 ayes, 2 nays, 5 excused and not voting, 3 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed on Final Reading. Before we go to the next bill, in the North balcony from Senator Carsten's and Senator Warner's Districts, it is my privilege to introduce 28 students fifth to eighth grades from Unadilla, Nebraska, public schools at Unadilla. The teacher is Miss Susan Moon and Mrs. Lana Urban. Will you raise your hand so we can see where you are and wish you good morning? For your information, we are processing several bills on Final Reading and the Constitution requires that all legislators must be in their seats and the bills must be read word for word. So there are about three, six, there are eight bills left. The Clerk will read LB 874 on Final Reading.

CLERK: Final Reading of LB 874.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? Those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: Record vote read. (See page 1384, Legislative Journal.) 41 ayes, 1 nay, 5 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.
