Senator Venditte offers an explanation of vote.

Mr. President, new study resolutions, LR 276 calling for a study by the LR 154 special committee; LR 277 calling for a study by the Business and Labor Committee in the still pending Joseph Soukup claim; LR 278, Administrative Rules dealing with the Jail Standards Board; LR 279 calling for a study on habitual criminal statute; LR 280 calling for a study of the Educational Television Network expanded coverage; LR 281 calling for a study on the Political Subdivision Budget Limit Act; LR 282 by Judiciary calling for to give guidance to Ag and Environment Committee in its interim activities when dealing with many issues of crucial importance to ag; LR 283, purpose of the study being to study issues raised in LB 665, Nebraska Aging Services Act.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Are you through, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: No, sir, I am not. Mr. President, I now have another motion on LB 743. Senator Lewis moves to return LB 743 to Select File for specific amendment. Read amendment as offered on page 1405, Legislative Journal.

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I mentioned this morning that I am doing this on behalf of my good colleague from Sarpy County, Orval Keyes. He wanted that kind of date in there for a little more negotiated time. It wasn't my idea to do it that way but Orval has represented that district so well and is one of my long time good friends and I agreed to put that back on for him. I move for the return of the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to return the bill for specific amendment. Is there any discussion? All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. We are voting to return the bill.
