CLERK: Mr. President, right before we get to Senator Kelly's amendment to the bill, Senator Haberman offers an explanation of vote and I have a whole series of interim study resolutions I need to read in.

Mr. President, in addition to that, Senator Chambers has an addendum to LR 233 which will be referred to the Executive Board.

Mr. President, getting back to 873, Senator Kelly moves to amend the bill. Read Kelly amendment found on page 1409 of Legislative Journal.

SENATOR KELLY: It would strike "areas of scenic beauty", but, Mr. Clerk, that section has been stricken and I would change that amendment to page 3, lines 26 and 27 striking the same language, no, correction, line 27 striking the same language, "areas of scenic beauty", and Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I am pleading ignorance on this bill so bear with me. You won't hear me do that very often. As I was of the opinion that we were adopting the white copy as the amendment to this bill and I had written my amendment regarding Section 1 which is not now a part of the bill, even though it is a part of the white copy, which the white copy was the second copy of the green copy, and now that I have put a little light in that part of my understanding, I want to talk to the amendment and the concern that I have. On page 3, the classification of which we would be attempting to put into the road system would be of this nature, scenic recreation which shall consist of highways or roads located within or which provide access to or through state parks, recreation or wilderness areas, other areas of geographical, historical, geological, recreational, biological, archeological significance or area of scenic beauty. I have chosen scenic beauty for my amendment on the basis that scenic beauty is probably one of the most difficult things in the world that you could put as a definition for anything. I was visiting
