SENATOR LABEDZ: Oh, that's what I wanted to know. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner, are you ready...we are through with Final Reading. Are you ready to start on Appropriations bills? The Clerk has got some items to read into the record, and then we will move to Appropriation bills 995 through 1002.

CLERK: Mr. President, very quickly, your Enrolling Clerk respectfully reports that she has on this day at 9:57 presented the Governor for his approval the following bills: 304, 440, 662, 680, 730, 782, 808, 862, 874, 885, 887 and 915.

Mr. President, Senator Beutler would like to print amendments to LB 627. (See page 1462 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, first of all there are E & R amendments for what, 995?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, I move the E & R amendments to LB 995.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried. The E & R amendments are adopted to 995.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Warner now moves to amend the bill with Appropriation Committee amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, the Appropriations Committee is moving three amendments to LB 995, which is the deficiency bill. The first amendment is an adjustment of \$1.00 in addition here so that the two amounts...two different amounts comes out the same. The second amendment only adds \$170.00 to the Board of Barber Examiners, purpose of which is to allow them to have the funds to reimburse the Board for three meetings left this year which is not an adequate level appropriation, and the third amendment is one which I believe Senator Kelly had printed in the Journal as well, but it appropriates \$18,950 from the State Building Fund back to LB 309, and this reflects funds that the
