SPEAKER MARVEL: No.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Sergeant at Arms has already been notified, Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Okay. We went back to Boston to get a senator one time on a bill that was important, we might have to go someplace to get Senator Chambers.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Ray, do you have a report on Senator Chambers? Senator Keyes, he is on his way upstairs, shall we proceed with the roll call, I'm not sure we want a roll call. You want a machine vote?
