SPEAKER MARVEL PRESIDING

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair has been lenient this morning but I do think that we ought to try to tie fairly closely to the rules which means that we remain in our seats during Final Reading.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Continued Final Reading of LB 986.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: Record vote read. (See pages 1568 and 1569, Legislative Journal.) 32 ayes, 13 nays, 3 excused and not voting, 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill fails with the emergency clause attached. We now will vote on 986 without the emergency clause. Those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. We are voting on 986 without the emergency clause on Final Reading. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: Record vote read. (See page 1569, Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Announce the vote.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 12 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion carried without the emergency clause attached. We have an appropriation bill to introduce. We will take that up now and then we will go back to 765.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Warner moves for the introduction of Request #1630 by the Appropriations Committee.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, this is the intent bill to accompany the appropriation bill. I move suspension of the rule and its introduction, suspension of rule first, right?

CLERK: Introduction first and then we will suspend them.

SENATOR WARNER: I move for its introduction, Mr. President.
