LR 219-221

PRESIDENT: All right, no further discussion, the question then is the adoption of LR 219. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries and LR 219 is approved and we go to LR 220.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 220 is offered by Senator Hefner. It is on page 1241. (Read LR 220.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. Chairman and members of the body, I explained this resolution to you just a little while ago. This would honor Hartington High in the runner-up spot for Class C. I move the adoption of this resolution.

PRESIDENT: Seeing no further discussion the question then is the adoption of LR 220. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the resolution.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries and LR 220 is adopted. The next legislative resolution is 221.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senators Pirsch, Goodrich and Stoney would like to have their names added as cointroducers to 221, first of all.

PRESIDENT: Any objection to adding the names stated by the Clerk? If not, so ordered and go ahead with...

CLERK: (Read LR 221.) It is on page 1242, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, it is indeed a pleasure along with Senator Stoney and others to introduce this resolution honoring Omaha Westside's basketball team, not only the outstanding play of individuals and a team but you notice also we mention the classroom.
