SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is to advance the bill to E & R for review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record the vote We are not through yet, legislators. We have still got one more item we want to start on.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the motion to advance (interruption).

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Now we have an A bill.

CLERK: Mr. President, 954A by Senator DeCamp. Title read.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp. The motion is the advancement of the A bill. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 2 nays on the motion to advance the A bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Now, Mr. Clerk, are you ready for the next bill?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Before if I may, Mr. President, Senator Newell would like to print amendments to 882; Senator Powers to 1002; and Senator Keyes and Hoagland to 873.

Mr. President, LB 643, title read. The bill was first read on January 9. It was referred to the Public Works Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. There are committee amendments pending by Senator Kremer's Public Works Committee.
