that fully qualify for an MBA, so to that extent, at least, the intent is clearly stated. I think Senator Koch is absolutely correct that the role to go probably is not one of a punitive one, in effect, as Senator Koch has indicated, upon the University's program, but I think they have ought to have got the message very clear from Senator Lewis' remarks and Senator Koch's, as well as my own, that it is intended that the program as we understood it was going to be is to be carried out, and I would think perhaps the demonstration here has made that clear and I would trust....I do not know where the fault lies exactly....I would suspect as is true in almost every instance there is fault to be placed on either institution. Although the Board of Regents, apparently, and the Board of Trustees apparently have been gotten able to get together, but at some administrative level below that there seems to be inability to get together. I would trust that the body would not support the Lewis amendment, but go along with I think the indication of the remarks that we expect the program to be carried out.

SENATOR CLARK: Is there any other discussion on the Lewis amendment? If not, Senator Lewis, do you care to close?

SENATOR LEWIS: I offered the motion at this time because I have asked that tomorrow coincidentally that we meet with the administrative types from both of the institutions along with Senator Warner and Senator Koch to resolve the issue. I wanted to make it clear that there is legislative concern and that this is a viable option in case that they don't get the message. I ask unanimous consent to temporarily withdraw both of the amendments and leave them pending.

SENATOR CLARK: All right, it is withdrawn.
