SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the Hoagland-Cullan amendment. All those in favor vote aye. All opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? This is a long process unless you will vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote. Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Mr. President, we had filed this amendment, I think that the record will reflect that we filed this amendment as an amendment to the committee amendments. Now we do have sufficient votes here to adopt it as an amendment to the committee amendments and. . . .

SENATOR CLARK: The committee amendments have been adopted. It takes 25 votes.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I would ask for a Call of the House and a roll call vote.

SENATOR CLARK: A Call of the House has been asked for. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 0 nays Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The House is still under Call. It was never raised before. Everyone check in please. Would you please record in. We have eighteen yet that haven't recorded. Three are excused. They are all here but two Senator Hoagland. Senator Hefner and Senator Wesely. Now only Senator Hefner. Senator Hoagland do you want to start with the roll call? Go ahead, call the roll.

CLERK: Roll call vote. 22 ayes, 19 nays, 3 excused and not voting, 5 present and not voting Mr. President. Vote appears on page 1808 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion fails. Senator DeCamp, time is up on the bill.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I move the bill be advanced if there are no further amendments.
