LB 872, 872A

SENATOR HABERMAN: How much money does the bill now read?

SENATOR CLARK: \$25,000.

SENATOR HABERMAN: All right, and we are going to move to advance the bill?

SENATOR CLARK: That is right.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I ask for a roll call vote.

SENATOR CLARK: A roll call vote has been asked for on the advancement of the bill. All those in favor of advancing it vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Did you want a roll call?

SENATOR HABERMAN: We will have a record vote.

SENATOR CLARK: All right, a record vote.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Voting on the advancement of 872. Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 11 nays, 9 present and not voting, 2 excused and not voting. Vote appears on pages 1866-67 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is advanced. Now we have 872A.

CLERK: I have nothing on the bill Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Doesn't the bill have to be amended now to include the new salary increase?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman moves to indefinitely postpone LB 872A. That would lay the bill over Mr. President.

Mr. President, Senator DeCamp moves to suspend Rule 7, Section 3 and take up the kill motion today.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I think that it is self evident.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Koch, did you want to talk on the. . . Senator George? Senator Newell?
