

SENATOR HABERMAN: I can use my time thinking or talking can't I Mr. President? I'm thinking. I'm thinking of something to say to try to change some peoples minds. I have been asked to withdraw my kill motion. I am not going to withdraw my kill motion because I think that I am right. I don't know why everybody is. . . . on the Public Service Commission's side all of a sudden. I can't understand this. All of a sudden they are coming out to be the fair haired boys. They need a 20% increase and the state employees get 8%. The committee wanted to give them 35%. I don't even want to give them 10%. But boy the way things are going around here now with the revenues coming down and money getting tight, sure the salary is good only for four years but \$20,000 is a lot of money a year too, in the next four years. I still think that I am right. So I ask you to vote with me, not against me. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Koch, did you wish to talk on the kill motion? Senator Koch, did you wish to talk on the kill motion?

SENATOR KOCH: I move the previous question.

SENATOR CLARK: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? The question is ceasing debate. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate.

SENATOR CLARK: Debate is ceased. You have nothing to answer so we will vote on it. The motion before the House is the indefinite postponement of 872A. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no. 7 ayes, 26 nays on the motion to indefinitely postpone.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion lost. Is there anything further on the bill?

CLERK: Yes sir. Senator George moves to amend the bill Mr. President to read \$12,500. \$12,500. It is offered by Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, thank you, the \$12,500 in the A bill number one I have been told has to be done. We do have to have an A bill because we are talking about Constitutional offices, the \$12,500 reflects the increase for the five Public Service Commissioners for half a year beginning January 1981. So, that is the reflection of half a year for the increase as we have previously voted on LB 872
