

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker, if I have any more time left I would like to turn it over to Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. Speaker, fellow senators, Senator DeCamp's little puppy that he had last year has grown up to a mangy, ratty old dog. This bill doesn't help it a bit. SENATOR CLARK: One moment, Senator Merz.

SENATOR MERZ: I move that we be recessed until 11:10.

SENATOR CLARK: That is not a debatable motion. All those in favor of recessing until 11:10, vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Voting on recessing until 11:10. Record the vote.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 21 nays to recess Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: We are not recessed. Senator Cullan.
