SENATOR CLARK: There is nothing on the bill?

CLERK: No sir.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion before the House is the advancement of the A bill. All those in favor say aye, all those opposed nay. The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President.....

SENATOR CLARK: 964

CLERK: Yes sir, there are E & R amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. President, I move those E & R amendments to LB 964.

SENATOR CLARK: You heard the motion, all those in favor say aye, all those opposed nay. The E & R amendments are adopted. Anything further on the bill?

CLERK: Yes. Mr. President, Senator Koch moves to amend the bill and the Koch amendments are on page 1231 of the Journal.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: I withdraw those amendments.

SENATOR CLARK: They are withdrawn.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: 964, Constitutional amendment is going to be advanced to E & R. Senator Lamb, did you want to discuss it?

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, members, as I read the bill now it really doesn't say anything. The Constitutional amendment, what does it say John, something to the effect that the Legislature shall establish funding for schools which does not impose an undue burden on property or some such wording. I would like to hear your explanation as to what the bill would do. It seems to me that it is a bill now that Senator Schmit says does nothing, hurts nobody, helps nobody and costs nothing. Is that correct?
