LB 1004, 954, 959, 964,
991, 992

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, a point of personal privilege.

PRESIDENT: State your point.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I have heard five times the rumor that I intend to resign from this body after November and I wish to state emphatically that I do not intend to resign after the first of November. I am sorry, fellows, it will take two more years and they kick me out but I am not going to resign. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you for setting the record straight, Senator Haberman. And now, mercifully, we have reached the last bill of this session, I guess, for Final Reading. Mr. Clerk, you will proceed to read LB 1004.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Final Reading of LB 1004.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relating to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1004 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Record vote read. (See pages 2014 and 2015, Legislative Journal.) The vote is 41 ayes, 5 nays, 1 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting.

PRESIDENT: LB 1004 passes with the emergency clause attached. Now, Mr. Clerk, do you have some matters to read in?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President, first of all, the Appropriations Committee will be meeting now in Room 2102 to consider line item veto possible overrides of LB 1002. Appropriations Committee, Room 2102.

Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports they have carefully examined LB 954 and find the same correctly enrolled; 959 correctly enrolled; 964, 991, 992, all correctly enrolled. (Signed) Senator Wesely.

PRESIDENT: While the Legislature is in session and capable of doing business, I propose to sign and I do sign LB 954, 959, 964, 991, 992. Proceed with any other matters, Mr. Clerk.
