SENATOR DeCAMP: Whatever it takes?

SENATOR NEWELL: Whatever it takes.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Senator DeCamp. Would Senator DeCamp yield to a question? John, when you look at Section 1 (d), doesn't the purpose of the resolution really state that we should not ratify SALT II?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Does it say that in there?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yep.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Well, I would assume that that is wise policy then.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the DeCamp resolution. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Record the vote.

CLERK: Record vote read. (See page 2018, Legislative Journal.) 28 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President on the adoption of the resolution.

SENATOR CLARK: The resolution is adopted. Now we have LR 344. This is the last one.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 344. The first thing I have is Senator Merz and Senator George would like to have their names added as coinroducers.
