CLERK: 35 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. The resolution is adopted. Now we go to LR 347.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 347 is offered by the membership, specifically Senator Maresh. Read. (See pages 2019 and 2020, Legislative Journal.) Mr. President, in order to take that resolution up today we will need to suspend Rule 4, Section 6.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, this resolution was passed around. I think almost everybody signed the resolution. What it does, it just commends the town of Milligan, a small town of a little over 300 population, that built an auditorium during the years that we had trying times starting in 1929. The celebration of opening was held in 1930 and now they are celebrating their 50th anniversary. The auditorium was built without any federal, state or local governmental funds. It was kept up all these years and it is a community center that the people are proud of and I think we should suspend the rules and act on that resolution today.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the suspension of the rules. Senator Clark. Okay, the motion is to suspend the rules. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. LR 347. Record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 3 nays on the motion to suspend the rules, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The rules are suspended. Now we need to vote on the resolution, right?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of adopting the resolution as explained by Senator Maresh vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 1 nay on adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.
