PRESIDENT LUEDTKE PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: The Legislature will come to order. Prayer this afternoon by Pastor Robert Raabe of the Evangelical United Lutheran Church here in Lincoln. Pastor Raabe.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Pastor. Roll call. Have you all recorded your presence? Some of you have not done so. Have you all recorded your presence? Record the presence, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Legislature might like to observe the entrance of Governor Frank Morrison and Mrs. Morrison. Maxine, nice to see you. Governor Morrison. At approximately this time the Supreme Court families are being escorted into the Chamber and will be followed by the Lieutenant Governor-elect's family and guests who some of which have already been escorted in. SERGEANT AT ARMS WILSON: Mr. President, two distinguished members of the Nebraska Congressional District, the Honorable James J. Exon and Mrs. Exon; the Honorable Edward Zorinsky and Mrs. Zorinsky.

PRESIDENT: Sergeant at Arms, would you just wait, I am going to appoint some escorts for Senators Zorinsky and Exon. Senators Hannibal and Rod Johnson, would you return to the rear of the Chamber and escort Senators Zorinsky and Exon, United States Senators Zorinsky and Exon to the front of the Chamber? The Chair recognizes Sergeant at Arms Ray Wilson.

SERGEANT AT ARMS WILSON: Mr. President, the National Guard Color Guard will now advance and post the colors.
