LR 33, 35

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of Resolution 33. All those in favor signify by voting aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to adopt the resolution.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LR 33 is adopted. LR 35. Senator Vickers.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 35 is found on page 685 of the Journal.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. Clerk, do you want to go ahead and read the resolution, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: (Read LR 35.)

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, as most of you probably know this week has been designated teacher recognition week by the Governor, by the proclamation of Governor Kerrey last week, and this resolution is designed for this body to recognize that contribution that these people make to the education of all of our citizens. Now I would also like to point out that these people do come in for a considerable amount of criticism at times and, quite honestly, there are probably some of them that perhaps do deserve some criticism but I think it is rather nice once in awhile if, as most of us know, that politicians get a lot of criticism, too, but occasionally it is nice if somebody compliments us on something we do. So I would like to take this method for this body to compliment those thousands of people out there that are dedicated and doing a good job, in my opinion, working hard to provide a system of education in this state that we can be proud of. So with that, Mr. President, I would urge the adoption of LR 35 and I would also state that if there, and maybe you might want to do this on the Board, if there is any members of this body that would like to co-introduce this resolution, I would be happy to have their names added to it. If you would want to open the Board for that reason, it would be fine with me.
