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and those that do not should have a fine including the purchase of a permit. I, therefore, oppose the amendment and suggest that the members of this Legislature do the same. Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Higgins. Could we have quiet in the Chamber, please.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Mr. President, would Senator Labedz yield to a question or two?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Senator Labedz, would this apply to those people coming from Colorado, Kansas, South Dakota, Iowa, all the states?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Absolutely.

SENATOR HIGGINS: In other words, they would be putting into our treasury then and we would be forcing them to help pay for the use of our parks.

SENATOR LABEDZ: That is correct.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Not just the people of Nebraska.

SENATOR LABEDZ: That is correct.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Also the people that want to walk through the parks or ride through the parks on a bicycle, we have to remember this is a vehicle entry fee and they can have as many people as they want in the car or they can walk through the park or ride on a bicycle but they must have a permit for each vehicle.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you. Senator Chambers, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I will.

SENATOR HIGGINS: We aren't messing with the criminal code here, are we? That uniform criminal code we don't dare touch.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I am trying to keep you from messing it up.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Okay, this is not going to affect the
