SPEAKER NICHOL: May I tell you that next week we will be pretty much going back to priority bills on General File. We will be taking up Senator Pat Morehead's bill having to do with the food tax. Senator Kilgarin has a resolution that will be attempted to raise from the committee having to do with the Legislature handling the financial affairs of the University of Nebraska on probably Tuesday. And, of course, we go to full time sessions next week. May I just say that you have done very, very well with your work in committees. The Chairman's congratulation to you for handling so well. I do have a suggestion that perhaps some of these should be worked over a little bit so that we don't arrive at a situation like we did this morning on too many bills. We have it figured out so that if we spend approximately two hours on each priority bill that comes up, we will get through with priority bills, and this should be enough time to do it unless we get bogged down too many times. I will be calling some of you in on specific bills so that this doesn't happen because some of this can be worked out in smaller groups rather than harping it all out word by word on the floor. So with that, Senator Hannibal, would you adjourn us until Monday morning at ten o'clock.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Yes, Mr. Speaker, I certainly would move that we adjourn until Monday morning at ten o'clock.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Goodrich asked which day we were going into full day session, and, of course, that is Monday. This coming Monday we go into full day session. You have heard the motion to adjourn until ten o'clock Monday morning. All those in favor say aye, opposed nay. We are adjourned.

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
