RECESS

SPEAKER NICHOL PRESIDING

SPEAKER NICHOL: If you would record your presence now I think we would have enough to start, please. Thank you. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay we will move on down to priority bills, LB 539.

CLERK: Mr. President, if I may right before that, Senator Warner would like to print amendments to LB 617. (See page 1520 of the Legislative Journal.)

I have a communication from the Speaker regarding referral of LR 62 to the Reference Committee. (See pages 1520-1521 of the Legislative Journal.)

Your committee on Enrollment and Review reports LB 120 and 306 and 207 all correctly engrossed, Mr. President. (See page 1521 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, on 539 there are E & R amendments pending.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Rod Johnson.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I move that we adopt the E & R amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All those in favor say aye, opposed nay. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the bill is offered by Senator Carsten.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Cal Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this is the first one, I've got two, this is the first one. All this amendment does is on page 8, line 13, after the words "retailer licensee" strike the period and insert a semi-colon and add, "in the case of agricultural lime slurry, the fee shall be paid on the base lime material only." Now there was some disagreement between the people that were supplying the materials and the introducers of the bill, the Nebraska Farm Bureau in this area and because of a double taxation kind of a situation and it was justifiable in their objection to it, I'm sure. Now they sat down and worked this amendment out to their mutual satisfaction and agreed to this for clarification purposes. So with that explanation, Mr. President, I would move for the adoption of this first amendment.
