collar criminal, the no collar criminal is the one that this society is concerned about, yet these levels of people don't commit the crimes that endanger the integrity of the system and the government itself. Those who corrupt the system, who corrupt investigative agencies, who ignore the crimes committed by people in high places, those types of individuals are given respect and consideration. It is not expected that this law as drafted will touch any of those individuals.

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So it will pass but I want the record to show that I was very much opposed to it, that I spoke against it, that not being mentally incompetent I knew what was going to happen to the bill. As somebody characterized the situation they faced, it is like running a pussycat into a den of Doberman Pinschers, except that if you have enough pussycats and you run one Doberman Pinscher among them, the sheer weight of numbers will allow the pussycats to overwhelm the Doberman. But if they come to get a meal, the Doberman may at least get a sandwich. So today you will laugh. Today you will prevail. Today you will distort the system but it won't always be thus. It won't always be thus. And if people ever have enough interest in the actions of this Legislature to find out why we did what we did, anytime they come across the name "Chambers", they will see reasons not merely arguments, not merely mouthing those things fed to me by somebody else.
