LB 255, 405, 703, 752, 653

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on LB 752? If not, all those in favor of advancing the bill from General File, vote aye. Opposed, vote nay. We are voting on the advancement of LB 752 from General File. Please record your vote. Voting on the advancement of LB 752. Please record your vote. May we have your cooperation, please, in recording your vote on the advancement. Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Mr. Speaker, Speaker Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, looks like rolling along quite well this morning but I'd like to draw your attention to three bills on Select that we could move, should we get through with General, with this group we're on and they are LB 703, 255, and 405.
