LB 813

SENATOR MCDONALD: Mr. President and members of the body, I am not so sure I want to support LB 813 but I do rise to support the Hannibal amendment to it. As was stated by Senator Hannibal, Millard has if not the only one, one of the few school districts in the state that are increasing enrollment every year and with the predicted growth it appears like they will in the future. I think it also needs to be pointed out that Millard has done an excellent job of the amount of per pupil cost, excuse me. It is one of the lowest in the state and for many of the same reasons that Senator Hannibal has pointed out, I would like to urge you to support the Hannibal amendment to LB 813. Thank you.
