PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Goll. (Gavel.) May we have order, please.

SENATOR GOLL: Mr. President and colleagues, Senator Remmers, it sounds to me like Johnny has got a deal for you and I'll let you respond to that, but I rise to support the kill motion and for only a brief moment I want to call your attention to the handout that Senator Remmers sent out, the big one with the flow chart. And I just want to call your attention to the fact that we're spending \$550,000 a year to administer this program. I talked to the superintendents in my district. They feel it's time that the program ceased and so, therefore, I rise, Senator Remmers, to support you in your effort to kill this bill and I'll let you respond to Senator DeCamp's deal. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lynch, do you wish to speak again? Senator Lynch, your light is on, do you wish to speak again?

SENATOR LYNCH: (Response inaudible.)

PRESIDENT: Are there any further discussions on the motion before the House which is to indefinitely postpone LB 126? If not, Senator Remmers may close. Senator Remmers, you may close on your motion. May we have order in the Chamber, please, keep your conversational level lower, please. (Gavel.) Senator Remmers.

SENATOR REMMERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Johnny again says about those poor investments of the permanent school fund, yes, those investments were not good, but I think the answer to that would have been simply change the investments, though that is no longer a problem. Again that's one of those straw men, you know, it was those terrible investments that we had the permanent school fund money in. But what we're saying about this is really that the school boards are too stupid out there to take care of their energy problems, that the only reason we got these energy savings done is because the great father over here in the Legislature decided here, we'll give you some money and tell you how to spend it and that way we'll get it done right. I don't believe that we can point to very many things that show that we are so much wiser than our school
