PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Scofield.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Mr. Speaker and members, I would withdraw this amendment and offer as a substitute the amendment that has been circulated this morning on your desk.

PRESIDENT: Is there objection to her withdrawing the amendment? Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: (Microphone not activated immediately.) ...I don't want to object to withdrawing the amendment. I understand. But the matter of substitution affects then all the other ordered amendments.

PRESIDENT: The amendment was originally on by unanimous consent. That is the only thing the Chair can say.

SENATOR LANDIS: I'm not going to object to withdrawal of the amendment. I would object to the substitution of an amendment.

PRESIDENT: Well, then there is an objection to the procedure. There is an objection to the substitution, Senator. So if you withdraw the amendment, it cannot be considered. The next amendment.
