SENATOR WESELY: Rather than call ins I would ask for a roll call vote, please.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, roll call vote has been asked for. Please record your presence. Several of you here have not recorded your presence. Senator Hefner, do you want to record your presence, please. Thank you. Senator Conway, would you record your presence, please. Senator Vickers, Senator Lamb and Senator Vard Johnson, please return to the Chamber. We are looking for Senator Vard Johnson. Senator Wesely, do you want to wait for Senator Vard Johnson or do you want to go ahead?

SENATOR WESELY: That's okay.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, a roll call vote has been asked for and we are voting on the indefinite postponement of LB 213. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on pages 1322-23 of the Legislative Journal.) 24 ayes, 22 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to indefinitely postpone.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion loses. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I would like to...oh, there is more?

CLERK: I have other motions, Senator. Mr. President, the next motion I have is by Senator Higgins. Senator Higgins would move to bracket until April 8, 1985.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you, Mr. President.
