SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is, shall the Speaker be overruled? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. It takes 23 votes I believe now with the number we have excused. Have you all voted? Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, I'll go ahead and ask for a call, please, and call ins.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, the question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Please return to your seats and record your presence. Those outside the Legislature, please return to the Legislative Chambers and record your presence. There are four excused. Please record your presence. Several of you are present and have not recorded your presence. Look up to see if your green light is shining. If it isn't, please punch your green button. I'm looking at some of you who have not punched your green button. Thank you. Senator Haberman, would you punch your green button, please. Thank you. I'm looking for Senator Schmit. Okay, Senator Schmit is the only one we're looking for. Senator Wesely, would you like to wait for Senator Schmit or do you want to go ahead? Oh, he is here.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, we can go ahead.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Well, he is here now so we'll go ahead.

SENATOR WESELY: That's fine.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Now it takes 24 members since...24 affirmative votes to overrule the Chair. The question is, shall the Chair be overruled? Did you ask for a record vote, Senator Wesely? Senator Wesely, may I have your attention? What did you ask for.

SENATOR WESELY: I think it would be fine to go ahead with a roll call, Mr. Speaker, but if you could, I think maybe
