CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Vickers...you want to withdraw that, right, Senator?

PRESIDENT: Senator Vickers, did you wish to withdraw an amendment?

SENATOR VICKERS: Yes, Mr. President. I do not wish to give them anymore power. I want to take all the power I possibly can away from them. Thank you.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schmit then has an amendment that I understand he wishes to withdraw. Mr. President, the next motion I have to the bill is offered by Senators Vickers and Warner. They would move to indefinitely postpone the bill. That would lay it over, unless the introducers agree to take it up at this time.

PRESIDENT: Senator Pappas and Senator Rogers, what do you want to do, take it up? Take it up now. Very well. The motion is to indefinitely postpone the bill. The Chair recognizes first Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, members, I think it is unfortunate that we came full circle and back to this point because I think it is important that agriculture recognize that what affects agriculture happens in the political arena. I certainly recognize that, but there are a lot of turkeys in this state that don't, undoubtedly. They don't want to recognize it to the fact that they also know that if we give them that power they have got to not be heavy-handed with that power. You know it is unfortunate that the...

PRESIDENT: Senator Vickers, I'm going to try to get some order for you. (Gavel.)

SENATOR VICKERS: I don't particularly care, Mr. President. Thank you very much. I'm just making these statements for the record anyhow.
