

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Hoagland a question, if he will yield.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hoagland, would you respond, please.

SENATOR HEFNER: Senator Hoagland, do you agree that the way this bill has been amended, with all those pages in the white sheet, that it does deal with lotteries?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Well, only incidentally with lotteries, Senator Chambers, is my opinion. It is a bill that really deals with pickles.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, isn't a pickle a form of lottery? Doesn't the bill say that any lottery conducted by means of the pickle card, isn't that what the bill says?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Well, I don't...what is your next question, Senator Chambers? I don't know what you are driving at.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, if you can't answer that one, then you wouldn't be able to answer the next one. Let me see if I can find...all right, let's look on page 1 of the white copy, line 10, starting with the last word on the line, "any lottery, raffle or lottery by the sale of pickle cards." Then in line 15, "any lottery, raffle or lottery by the sale of pickle cards." Then in line 17, "any lottery, raffle or lottery by the sale of pickle cards." Are lotteries being...are pickle cards a means of conducting lotteries, based on the language of the bill?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Well, not as I understand lotteries, no.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. He doesn't even understand the bill. Here is somebody who is going to stand up with you, and I think he graduated from Yale, and tell you what is germane and not germane to this bill and he doesn't even know what the bill says. I'm going to see if I can get some help from Senator Conway. Senator Conway, you have an amendment up there, so I want to see if you understand this bill. Are lotteries conducted through pickle cards? Is the pickle card a means of conducting a lottery, or form of lottery?
