SENATOR HIGGINS: All right. Mr. President, I did not understand why we had five votes and nothing else. That's why I...I didn't know if it was because you didn't hear me ask for the advancement of the amendment or if the rest of the people, none of the attorneys here understood the amendment or what?

PRESIDENT: Well maybe we'll never know, Senator, but we are now on a call of the house and I guess we need your authorization to take call ins.
