But we are hopeful, we are hopeful that a lot of these mail order houses will just voluntarily collect the tax for the State of Nebraska as do the other merchants in our state. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: I have one other light for recognition. Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I don't think we let the other merchants, who are in our state selling to Nebraskans, voluntarily do it. I think it is a mistake to put a statute on our books that allows someone outstate to voluntarily do it. Either they do it by law, or they do not. I will be voting against this bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Baack, do you wish to close?

SENATOR BAACK: Yes. Mr. President, colleagues, I'll just have a short closing here. I think what I'll do is I'll just withdraw my motion and urge you, for the reasons that you've heard, to vote against the advancement of this bill. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Very well. The motion is withdrawn. We will proceed to read LB 552. All members in your seats, please, so that we may resume Final Reading. If we may have members in your seats (gavel) and revert back to our rules (gavel) for members to be in your seats during Final Reading, please. (Gavel.) Mr. Clerk, proceed with 552.

CLERK: (Final Reading of LB 552.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 552 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk. Senator Hefner.

PRESIDENT: Roll call vote has been requested. Proceed. Senator Beutler.
