

agreements and that is why you are killing all these programs because you made agreements, agreements with white people, but the treaties made with the Indians under the most solemn circumstances were not worth the paper they were written on, and that is what we are dealing with here. The broken promises, the broken treaties, the lack of regard for anything not white, and we all know this. Look around this Capitol Building at the employee ranks. You wouldn't think that anything was in this state other than white people. There are a few black people in some flunky jobs. They crawl around here at night mopping the floors, putting down wax, cleaning up the filth left here by the master race just as our mothers and our grandmothers and our aunts have to go into your homes and raise your children, work in the hospitals and the nursing homes taking care of your sick and your old, believing, you do, that we won't change the labels on medication so that when a doctor picks up one substance it is really another and that is a way we can help get rid of our enemy.

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You trust us. You don't think we will try to get even, we won't take revenge. You will turn your back on us because we won't stick a knife in it, but when you are around each other, everybody sits with his or her back to the wall. We cook your food, we don't spit in it, we don't put poison in it. We don't grind up glass and put in it but we have sufficient provocation, and when the day comes that the worm turns, you helped turn the worm. You helped close off every door and every possibility of an amicable solution to a serious problem, and by sitting in this Chamber and feasting off the lobbyists, you are insulated from the reality of what is happening on the streets, rural as well as urban, and you don't have enough SWAT team members, you don't have enough cops if you want an "us against them" situation because there are more of us than there are them. But if that is the kind of situation that you are broadcasting to the people in Nebraska that you have in mind, so be it. I don't have enough votes to stop you and I can't beat you here but there will be other days and other places.
