PRESIDENT: Motion fails. The Chair would like to announce that there are visitors in the galleries this morning we are glad to welcome to the Legislature. That is offered by Senator Vickers. Senator Withem, as introducer, would have the option to lay it over, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We'll take it up now. Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, members, this bill is a bill that advanced on consent calendar. I raised the issue at that time that it was poor public policy to adopt the policy outlined in LB 437. That is the reason I put the indefinite postpone motion up there.
