Mr. President, I would certainly like to see the bill advance in a very short time.

SENATOR SIECK: I think enough has been said. It is a Public Works bill, so I chose it as my priority bill. So I'll move to advance the bill.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schmit would offer LB 474A. (Read title.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Schmit, please.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I believe we've had enough discussion. I move the advancement of the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the advancement of the A bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.
