

SENATOR PIRSCH: Correct.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay. Would the Clerk read the last sentence of the amendment, because I don't understand it and I wonder if it has a technical error.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Now, if you will notice, the quote is before the period. It is the beginning of the rest of the committee language. There was some confusion about that but if you do exactly what the amendment says, strike lines 5 through 7 and insert, then when you continue on with line 8, that is a continuation of that "the court or board of parole shall...".

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay, so that is not a period there? That is not a complete sentence then.

SENATOR PIRSCH: The period is only...correct, the period is after the quotation, not included in that quotation marks. It is not correct English but it is correct in this case to designate.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay, because I could not understand...

SENATOR PIRSCH: There is no period, no, there is no period after that parole.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Correct.

SENATOR DECAMP: That's all I had.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Thank you, Senator DeCamp. We are back to Senator Hoagland on the amendment.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Yes, I would ask the adoption of the committee amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The question is, shall the committee amendments be adopted? All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on adoption of the committee amendments.
