find at some point later on that this amount of money is not going to be sufficient then for the balance of the study we can come back in and ask for some additional monies. But we did feel like to come right up front with the total dollars was not putting a ceiling on the money that was going to be used for that but would literally be a floor if indeed we went to a bidding process. It appears, at least from the explanation that I had from the fiscal staff, that we are all right to do it this way and would not be using any new money but would be using only that which could then be reappropriated. So I guess at this point I'm saying to you that at least in my opinion at this point I believe that it is all right. Thank you.
